                  First things first. If Angelo was
13

     around, the first thing he would say about the
15
     fact that we are speaking about him on the floor
     of the Senate is {sound of disgust}. You see,
16
17
     Angelo Falcon, who was a mentor to so many
18
     Puerto Rican and Latino activists, scholars, was
     somebody who cared little for pomp and
19
20
     circumstance. If you ever saw him, he was not --
     he didn't necessarily iron his clothes that much,
21
     and he didn't necessarily worry about getting
22
     places quickly. But he was somebody who was
23
     incredibly astute, incredibly smart. In Spanish
24
25
     we would use the word tajante, which would be
```

"cutting."

He dedicated his life to finding data, to mining data in government. One of the things that he cared about more than anything else was participation of people of color, particularly Latinos, in public institutions, in government. He believed, as many of us do, that having the representation of -- as diverse a representation as possible in government would lead to better policy and to better government.

And therefore, he gathered data, he demanded data, he scoured data, and he gave it to whomever he needed to give it to. People who sometimes didn't like him that much -- because again, he was a cutting man who gave it to you just like he saw it. If he believed that you weren't doing the right thing, he was just going to tell you. People that don't like him, even those folks were forced to respect him.

It was kind of a sudden loss just a few weeks ago. And I remember that back when I started working in the Senate back in 2003, I worked in the Senate, as many of you folks know, as a staffer before I was a Senator, long before. And one of the individuals who was responsible

for making sure that I am here, Lucia Gomez, who is -- was one of his mentees and used to work for the Senate, I took her job at who was then the Democratic leader's office, David Paterson. That was a while back. And one of the things that she suggested right at the beginning of my tenure was that I should go and sit with Angelo Falcon.

I went and sat with him in a dark office in the southern part of Manhattan, surrounded by books and papers, and he gave me this look that told me the only reason he was talking to me was because Lucia had suggested that he sit with me. He took my questions in stride, and he educated me about the work that he had been doing for years and about the work that unfortunately government wasn't doing to have true representation of Latinos in different levels of power.

And since then, I learned so much from him over the years. And more importantly, I worked with so many folks who respected him who were his mentees -- I know that some of my colleagues are going to share some of their experiences. But bottom line is that this person who we called guerrero, or a warrior -- who cared

very little, again, for pomp and circumstance. 1 2 He would -- like if he was still here with us and 3 I told him I was going to do a resolution on his 4 behalf, he would not come in and sit in the room. 5 He would never have done that. He would have watched it from home and gone like {sound of 6 7 disgust \}, watched it halfway through and turned 8 it off. 9 But there's many of us who recognize 10 that without the advocacy that he made throughout his entire career, without the push that he made 11 12 to government entities -- who sometimes still 13 don't respond the way that they're supposed to, 14 who still don't have the representation they're 15 supposed to have -- it is individuals like him, who -- certainly a curmudgeon, he can certainly 16 be described as that. But he was a wise one, and 17 18 I'm going to miss him greatly. I think that the Puerto Rican 19 20

community, the Latino community, the advocacy community mourns for this man, who many of us again called a warrior, a guerrero. I think he's been an important part of who the Latino and Puerto Rican community is in the State of New York. And I will miss him greatly. I thank

him for his efforts. I thank his family members for lending him to us as much as they did.

And I look forward to continuing his work and, based on the work that he's done over the years, to make sure that we never forget that government should respond to the interests of all people, and having a diverse workforce and a diverse representation at all levels of government is necessary and important. He taught me that, he taught many of us that. And I will miss him greatly.

He was against injustice. He pointed it out and fought it, and if you didn't like, he didn't care. He really did not care. In fact, I suspect he took a special delight if you didn't like it, because he would tell you the truth in season or out of season.

And we all have benefited from people like this. And every community has these type of folk who, you know, will spend their lives trying to find and root out injustice and things of that nature. And I think that we all have a debt to pay to these types of every community.

So I'm just here to celebrate the life of Mr. Falcon and look forward to the next Falcon arising and -- falcon arising, hmm -- the next one that comes out and realizes that the work is not over. As long as there is injustice, somebody needs to do something about it.

So I'm grateful that he did, and I'm grateful that his family allowed it. And I look forward to greeting the next one, whatever religion, ethnic, race that they all -- or sex that they come in. Or faith. Or anything else that I have left out that they appear in. I

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look forward to it.

When crafting initiatives that are important to any 3 4 community, but in my case the Latino community, 5 having reliable data, having a reliable foundation of which to balance and create policy 6 7 is of the utmost importance. 8 So I think it's so important that we 9 give tribute to people like Angelo Falcon and 10 pioneers like him who make it possible for people like myself to stand here as an elected official, 11 12 as a State Senator, representing a community that has many challenges but has seen growth 13 14 throughout the years. And I'm very grateful to 15 him and to all of the pioneers for making that a reality. 16 And on a side note, Senator 17 18 Sepúlveda, who could not be here, asked if I 19 could convey his condolences to his friends and 20 family as well. 21 Thank you, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 22 Thank you, Senator Serrano. 23 24 Senator Parker. 25 SENATOR PARKER: Thank you,

Mr. President. On the resolution.

SENATOR PARKER: First let me begin by thanking Senator Rivera for his very eloquent words. And I think that they certainly summed up the life and the personality of Dr. Angelo Falcon. And I also want to just associate myself with the remarks made by all of my colleagues on this great man's life.

Second, let me offer my personal condolences and prayers and comfort to the family. Because there's a lot of people who, although we're acknowledging his life as a scholar and public person, I'm sure there's people in his family who knew a very different Angelo Falcon and are now, you know, missing his presence. And so we want to be -- we want to acknowledge and say that we remember them.

Angelo Falcon, you know, was huge, obviously, in the Puerto Rican community, huge in the Latino community nationally as a scholar and as an activist and as somebody who you could always go to for information and knowledge about politics and policy. But he was no less

important in the African-American and black communities here in the city. And he was somebody who deeply understood the notion of coalition.

And he was no more polite to me than he was to Senator Rivera, but he certainly made time, you know, to talk to me and to give me information. And my interactions with him and the times that I had the honor and the privilege to learn from him certainly were impactful to me.

You see that even within the context of developing, you know, the institutes that he developed. And I think there's two things to talk about in the context of these institutes. The first is to understand that he started institution-building in the academic sense for the Latino community before anybody ever thought to do it. And that's when you hear Senator Serrano talk about him as a pioneer. He was certainly an academic pioneer -- not that he was the first to develop Puerto Rican studies or Latino studies, but certainly one of the first, and certainly saw the importance of developing institutions that would live beyond him in developing that understanding.

The second thing that I think is 1 critical is the transformation of the Institute 2 on Puerto Rican Policy to the National Institute 3 4 on Latino Policy, and understanding that as the 5 Latino community has grown and has not been as dominated by Puerto Ricans as it was in the early 6 7 years, that he became flexible and understood that for politics to influence policy, that in 8 fact it wasn't enough just to be Puerto Rican, 9 10 that you had to have a larger coalition. That first coalition was with 11 12 blacks, but then later on the coalition grew to other Latino groups. Right? And I saw that in 13 14 his work and the things that he was involved in. 15 But his impact on the policy and the politics of New York City and this country is 16 undeniable, it's significant, and it's 17 18 transcendent. And so for those things we remember him and we honor his memory today. 19 20 Thank you, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank 21 you, Senator Parker. 22 23 Senator Krueger. 24 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you, 25 Mr. President.

I'd like to also rise to give a shout out to the family of Angelo Falcon. What an incredibly valuable member of our community he was for so many years.

I got to work with Mr. Falcon probably over 30 years ago on a report on poverty in New York City and its distribution and the impacts it was having. And I remember him educating me at the time that simply defining people as a community because their parents all spoke Spanish was the wrong way to recognize differences and commonalities among different communities in the city.

And he was always a staunch advocate for what he believed and a staunch advocate for using data to prove your point. And he taught many people, many, many important lessons and was a true value to so many different issues that I think we just see and understand differently today compared to when he started his work and his life.

So for his family and his friends -- and I'm sure that because he gave and was so committed to his work that there was a price to be paid by everyone else sometimes -- that it was
