This bill also covers the ability to preserve your fertility for the future.

What this bill does is it addresses speculative tickets, that has been agreed upon by our Attorney General and the Assembly. It addresses a little bit of the bots violation, if there is one, and what kind of penalty would happen. It also addresses disclosure -- prices, fees and charges -- to make sure people know exactly what they're paying for. It also addresses the primary to secondary site transfer and what you need to do to disclose to a consumer that he or she is being redirected to a secondary site.

It also addresses the URL fraud. So if you go to someone's website -- let's use the example of the Yankees -- you expect to be on the official website of the New York Yankees. At times right now, you are not, you are actually on a secondary website.

This also addresses a 5 percent

1 paperless ballpark pass for people that would 2 like to be able to afford to go to a ball game, with regards to a specific number of games that 3 4 would be addressed and to a capacity of 30,000 5 people or more for a venue. It also -- it puts in a three-year 6 7 extender. Because the definition of insanity is 8 doing this thing over and over and over and expecting different results, and that's all we've 9 been doing for the past few years, is one-year 10 11 extenders. So we put in a three-year extender. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 13 Hoylman. truth of the matter is, without this legislation, 1 2 we're going back to the days when only the rich 3 can attend an event. 4 This legislation -- and granted, 5 this is a complicated issue, so there's no one piece of legislation that could fully address all 6 7 the issues involved. But without this legislation, you can be clear and certain of one 8 thing, that unless you're very wealthy or know 9 10 someone who's very wealthy or connected, you're 11 going to be shut out again. It wasn't exhaustive because we still don't have the transparency that is critical for this to work. I hear Senator Lanza's concerns about wanting to make sure that everybody has a chance. I agree. But that means transparency. You will not be able to see the face value of the ticket when you end up going and buying it for perhaps four or five times the face value on a secondary market.

Now, you might decide it's worth it to you to want to pay four or five times, but you should at least know what the face value is.

Because if for some reason you need to get a return on that or they cancel, that's all you're getting, the face value, not the four or five times you paid for it.

And if we believe that we want to make sure there's equitable opportunity for all to get these tickets, we're not addressing the fundamental problem that the primary venue doesn't have to let you know what percent of the

tickets are actually going on sale to the public.

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2

And the research by the AG's office, which if -- hopefully Senator Murphy read this detailed report -- shows that you can have up to 50 percent, 60 percent of the tickets being held or distributed on presale bases, and so those are never even open to the public to have an opportunity to buy.

And so at least we ought to be letting people know, when they are in search of a ticket to a Justin Bieber concert or a -- I'm just looking. Let's see, I'm neither a rapper or that much of a concertgoer, but I have all the names here -- anyone else's concerts that you used to be able to know that actually only 30 percent of the seats are being made available to you through the primary market, because 70 percent of them have disappeared some other way, and so you'll only be able to buy those on a more expensive secondary market.

So are there improvements in this bill compared to what we've had? Yes. Have we addressed the consumer protection problems that we will continue to have in New York State? No. Do I want to go backwards? No, I want to go

And they should only come back if they want to reduce it, permission to reduce, 24 25 which they don't need.

And all this bill is is a bill that allows for these extenders and some of the municipalities -- New Rochelle, Rye, Yonkers, Essex, Albany, Warren. And from a political standpoint, these counties are very different as far as the geographics and also different with respect to their politics, whether they have basically Republicans or Democrats leading their counties.

And if we do not pass this bill, monies that these municipalities have been relying on for years, for years, will stop, because we have not authorized those taxes to continue.

So I would hope that those who are considering possibly voting no consider what the effects would be. And most importantly, there's really no reason, no reason not to continue to allow these extensions. And there are extenders for -- that Democrats are requesting and extenders that the GOP is requesting, and they go all over the ballpark.

So we regulate and we pass and we put a limit on casinos, and we make agreements with, compacts with Native American casinos. And we think about and explore whether we're going to do sports betting or not, whether we're going to do Internet betting or not, what we're doing with OTBs, on and on.

And yet then we take a look at a bill like this, which basically says we will allow specific nonprofit facilities to become casinos. Not a full-fledged casino, but slot machines, which now are being called electronic bell jars in this bill. And we've already approved tax-free alcohol for these same facilities.

So I'm just wondering what the State of New York is thinking about when it's expanding a secondary market of lower-taxed gambling casinos with -- perhaps without the fancy lights.

What this legislation would do is it is anticipated very soon that the FDA will approve this drug, reclassify this drug so it can be used more broadly, and that this particular patient who has been in the trial -- and others -- can continue to use this drug that is having a profound impact on improving their quality of life and this issue of epilepsy.

The issue at hand is that it is likely that the FDA approval will happen within the next number of weeks after we are out of session. What this legislation does is empower and allow the Commissioner of Health to approve -- when it is reclassified at the federal level, to in turn reclassify it and to allow it to be legal at the state level.

This is one incident that is

And then when the housing code 9 10 violations or fire code violations pile up, these same individuals, who we refer to as slumlords, 11 12 that have taken advantage of our community don't pay those housing code violations. 13 What this legislation ultimately 14 15 does is it ensures that if these slumlords do not pay those housing code violations, that they're 16 held accountable, that they ultimately have to 17 18 pay, because that fine will be put on their tax roll at the end of the year. 19 20 With that, Mr. President, I vote I urge my colleagues to do the same. And I 21 22 thank my colleagues for their support on this bill. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 24 Senator 25 Kennedy in the affirmative.

I want to thank the advocates who came up here this week and the week before that. Amy Cohen, whose child would have been 18 years old tomorrow, and she lost her child when he was 9. Raul Ampuero lost his child just last month -- not because of signage or lack thereof. There was no speed cameras where these kids lost their lives.

So here we have an opportunity to do something, and we didn't do it. But yet tonight we're passing a bill on signage. It's not enough. We need to do something about this. We need to come back, or we need to pass it tonight. But this is not enough. Signage is not going to protect the children's lives.

And the next time a child loses his life in a school zone, I want you to remember tonight. Because you chose, you chose, to pass a bill on signage.

ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator

Lanza on the bill. 1 2 SENATOR LANZA: Thank you, Mr. President. 3 4 You know, I rarely engage in 5 hyperbole on the floor of this august body. I in fact detest it. I hate it back home too, when 6 7 people want to tell you that if you don't support their legislation, someone's blood is going to be 8 on your hands. But we've heard it tonight. 9 10 You want to talk about politics over safety? We in this body, back in the month of 11 12 May, passed a piece of legislation, 6212A, germane to this legislation. It would require 13 14 that the City of New York place a stop sign or 15 traffic signal at the four corners surrounding every school in the City of New York. 16 You know, a few years ago in my 17 18 district a young child was killed at an 19 intersection right outside a school, mowed down 20 by a motorist. There was no stop sign there. I submit to you, my colleagues, that a hidden speed 21 22 camera would never have prevented that tragedy from happening, but a stop sign probably would 23 24 have. 25 So some would say that we're putting

1 politics above safety. I would say that others 2 are putting money above the lives of children. That legislation has not become law in the State 3 4 of New York for one simple reason, because the 5 City of New York, my good friend Mayor de Blasio has opposed it and has asked the Assembly to 6 7 oppose it. The commissioner of DOT, a good person and a great commissioner, opposes it and 8 9 has asked the Assembly to oppose it and not to 10 pass it. 11 So can speed cameras be part of the 12 equation? Could they provide some measure of safety? Perhaps, as part of a comprehensive 13 14 plan. But I tell you all, nothing would do more 15 to slow a car down around a school in our city than a red light or a stop sign. 16 So let's put all this nonsense 17 18 behind us. Let's get together, let's really do 19 what we say we mean, which is provide safety for

These plants, I believe there's two left in New York -- one's in my district -- will be closed by 2020. And there's been a lot of lip service to the men and women who work there, some of whom will be getting up in just a few hours. But there's been no real policy or anything enacted to actually provide these employees with any type of transitional work to different energy production or any other kind of additional work to make sure these people are still employed after 2020.

It would create a one-year advanced notice to all workers at a coal generation facility, mandatory extensive health screenings for all employees, contractors and subcontractors working in a facility on the date of issuance, and worker retraining programs for all employees, contractors and subcontractors, to be conducted at the facility during the one-year advance notice period, to include training for things like biomass or natural gas plant operating skills.

As long as the policies continue on 1 2 the energy side to get rid of coal, to get rid of 3 nuclear, to prevent natural gas, to even kill 4 pipelines that carry natural gas, I believe 5 myself and many of my colleagues will continue to put forth legislation like this, because it's 6 7 important to our communities and it's important to working men and women who work at these 8 They deserve a lot more than lip 9 plants. 10 service; they deserve actual policies to help them transition in their own lives, and for our 11 12 communities. make any mistakes, she is tenacious and 1 2 passionate and unrelenting on behalf of her constituents. Unrelenting is a good word. If 3 you don't believe me, just ask the people in 4 5 Hoosick Falls. You don't believe me, go up to Saratoga and look at how she's worked on behalf 6 7 of the people up in Saratoga for racing and all those types of issues in the State of New York. 8 And she represents the best of what all of our 9 10 colleagues are, a very good local politician. And politician in this sense is a great word. I 11 12 embrace the word politician. And Senator Marchione, I will miss 13 14 you. Our colleagues will miss you. And the 15 State of New York will miss you for your service. So thank you for being amongst us. 16 Now, my colleague and friend who 17 18 started in service with my father; I had the 19 pleasure of serving with him in the Assembly and now in the Senate. There are so many things that 20 have been said, properly so, about Senator 21 Larkin. He is unbelievably loyal. Unbelievably 22 dedicated, unbelievably passionate about the 23 things that he believes in. 24 25 And most important, he loves, loves

You don't sometimes realize the imprimatur or the effect that people 16 have on you until they're not around. So maybe 17 18 it's a good way for us to take stock of who we are, appreciate each other on a daily basis, and 19 20 recognize that having someone like John go to be 21 with his family, enjoy other things outside of this Legislature -- you know what, from the 22 bottom of my heart to you, thank you for your 23 friendship, for your leadership, and for your 24 25 service.

I'm a better person because I know all these people. When I speak this way, I have the privilege of getting up to speak. Any one of us could have gotten up and said similar type things. It could have been Mike Gianaris, it could have been Neil Breslin, it could have been Senator Peralta. Everyone can extol the virtues of the people who serve here.

So on that note, I want to thank
Senator Stewart-Cousins for our good, solid,
strong working relationship. Yeah, a couple of
bumps in the road, but that's life. That's life
and that's politics. But I'm still amazed at how
many things that we've actually gotten done for
the people of the State of New York.

So thank you to all of you. I appreciate the indulgence of allowing me to make these comments. I hope everyone travels safely, gets enough rest so that you're bright-eyed and bushy-tailed to do your own petitions over the next couple of weeks. And as we get into the summer season, I hope everyone enjoys what a great, beautiful, wonderful state we live in.
