     to accurately tell a person who asks, Is there

     any gluten in this recipe or in this particular

     food?
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That takes on a liability, and it 1 2 really is not necessary. Gluten and celiac is not normally a life-threatening disease. If you 3 4 wanted to label all foods whether they are 5 peanut-free, which can be life-threatening, that is something I would consider. 6 7 But I have to ask the question in this one, where are we headed? It says we're not 8 going to label any food. And certainly any food 9 10 that is gluten-free is labeled gluten-free. But 11 there are so many things that just never have 12 gluten in them. Gluten is like a wheat, rye, barley and some other components. 13 14 This is just totally unnecessary, 15 expensive and I think starting down a path that has some liability with it, and I'm not sure what 16 the outcome and the goal is really to achieve 17 18 here. 19 So I vote no. 20 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Senator Little to be recorded in the negative. 21 22 Senator Jackson to explain his vote. SENATOR JACKSON: Thank you, 23 Mr. President and my colleagues. 24 25 I rise in support of this particular

bill. This is very personal to me. My grandson, 1 who's six years old, he's allergic to a lot of 2 wheat and stuff like that. And in fact 3 4 everywhere we go, no matter where we're going, to 5 the park or elsewhere, we carry a backpack with 6 the EpiPen in there just in case. 7 So when it comes to a pilot project with state-owned cafeterias that are operated or 8 leased, let's do this pilot project and see. 9 10 This is not to put it in permanently in every 11 state-owned place. So a pilot project, I'm 12 willing to go with that. But for someone who cares about 13 14 someone having an attack where I have to use an 15 EpiPen -- and you know the cost of EpiPens -- I think that a pilot project is appropriate. So I 16 17 ask all of you to consider that, as if your 18 grandson was your grandson. 19 Thank you.
