They don't have an obvious disability, but they claim they have a mental disability -- anxiety, depression, things like that.

And then other people see the person going to the room with a dog and wonder why they didn't bring their dog too, or their -- and I can't imagine how you could decide that you could do this, have a therapy cat in a hotel room and then rent it out afterwards.

So I'm definitely a no vote on this.

But I would really and truly like to see us look at somehow registering that you have a therapy animal, dog, and making sure that it's legitimate and certified and that you have something to show when you register in a hotel or a bed-and-breakfast or an inn, because it is definitely becoming a problem.

And therefore I vote no.

1 Ortt to explain his vote. 2 SENATOR ORTT: Yes, thank you, Mr. President. 3 4 I'm going to be voting no on this. 5 It's not because I disagree with the intent of the bill. I suspect the intent of the bill is 6 7 very laudable. 8 As someone who was the chair of the 9 Mental Health and Developmental disabilities 10 Committee for four years, we've passed some 11 really good legislation in this house to help families and individuals with a developmental 12 disability. 13 But we have an entire office for 14 15 people with developmental disabilities, scores of 16 individuals who spend -- their every task is to try and improve the lives of those who are 17 18 affected with a DD or their family members. We also created the Justice Center 19 20 several years ago, which was also tasked with 21 providing oversight of facilities around the 22 state that were there to serve people with developmental disabilities. 23 I don't know that creating another 24 25 office, creating more bureaucracy, is the

solution. I think if we're still seeing

     challenges -- and we are -- we have to focus on
     making OPWDD better. We have to fix the areas

And the points of my colleague are well-taken, and I share his position that I wouldn't want to see duplicative government.

But I do need to point out for my colleagues that in no way does this duplicate any existing services. Many years ago there used to be a state Office for the Advocate for People with Disabilities here in New York State. It was disbanded. As it stands right now, there is no place at a state agency level for a person with physical disabilities to turn to.

And that's what this office is for, people with physical disabilities. If you are deaf, if you are blind, if your mobility is impaired, there is no agency-level office or department in our state government for you to turn to for support and services. That's what this bill seeks to reestablish.

My understanding is the Assembly is also passing this bill today as well. And I would encourage my colleagues to support it, and let's reestablish this important department.

Stewart-Cousins, our leader, for allowing me to bring this bill to the floor, and my colleagues for supporting it.

As current law states, individuals who experience sudden accidents that lead to a drastic disability must continue to pay rent while simultaneously seeking alternative housing when their current housing no longer accommodates them because of their needs and their disability.

If an individual that is disabled can no longer live independently, then that person should have the right to leave their unsuitable housing without having to continue their lease.

This legislation covers any change in one's disability status that may render their current housing unsuitable, as well as any situation where a better option, such as an assisted living facility or subsidized housing, becomes available.

We want to be able to provide a situation where someone who's disabled can move to a residence house or any kind of suitable housing without having to bear the cost of continuously paying their rent.

In response to this tragedy, we are advancing the Anthony Amoros Law today to save lives and ensure consumers have full knowledge of an air bag status. Any car sold at auction will be required under this bill to disclose a nonfunctional or nonexistent air bag.

Anthony's family is here today, and I'm honored to host them in our chamber while we pass this lifesaving bill named after their beloved son and family member. With us are his parents, Alberto and Ivis Amoros, and his brother, Anthony's brother, Angelo Amoros.

I wanted to thank each of them for turning an unthinkable tragedy into a crusade to
