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O'Shea family. Last year they suffered the unimaginable loss of their son Ryan Patrick, who took his own life. But instead of cursing the darkness, they've lit a candle and, in his name, have started a foundation that has done tremendous work to raise awareness of mental health and to begin an important conversation about suicide, about how families should talk about it, recognize it, and take mental health out of the stigma out of which it's associated.

In their community of Rockville

Centre, they are leaders, and it is no surprise
that their son Ryan Patrick was a leader, a star
basketball and track player, loved by everyone.

But he suffered, unimaginably so. And their work
in his honor, in his name, has already changed a
community. It will continue to change other
communities.

And their work will continue to go on, with our support, because it must, because we must take this conversation out of the shadows and bring it into the light. And today it's important that we all recognize the work they're doing and in our own capacities carry it forward, as we must.

1 Thank you for your leadership. Your 2 sacrifice will always be recognized by us. together we can work so that it is not in vain 3 4 and so that other families will get the benefit 5 of so much of your heart and goodness. We are with you. We will stand together with you. Bethany Nacco, Linda's 7 daughter-in-law. Jamison Ott-Carpentar, the best 8 friend of the four King daughters. 9 Janet Steenburg, who lost her sons 10 Richard and Axel, and Richard's wife, Kim 11 Steenburg. Lynne Semprivivo, who lost her 12 daughter Erin. Sheila McGarvey, who lost her son 13 Shane. Jill Richardson Perez, who lost her son 14 15 Matthew. Donna Rivenburg, who lost her daughter Amanda. Mindy Grabina, who lost her daughter 16 17 Amy. 18 And, finally, we have Kevin, Sue and Hanna Cushing, who lost Patrick, who was one of 19 20 our own, part of our Senate family, working right here in the IT department in the Senate. 21 22 Thank you for joining us here today. All of these families have channeled 23 their grief into advocacy, and today we are 24 25 passing legislation to ensure that no other

family has to experience the heartbreak that they've experienced. Today the Senate passes 10 monumental reforms designed to ensure the safety of all New Yorkers when they choose to ride in a limo or for-hire vehicle.

The reforms we're passing today will undoubtedly strengthen safety standards here in New York. From requiring stretch limousines to be retrofitted with seat belts, to mandating commercial driver's licenses and drug and alcohol testing for drivers of vehicles with nine or more passengers, to increasing criminal penalties for drivers who break the law while on the road, we're taking significant steps to ensure safety measures are firmly in place when anyone steps into one of these vehicles.

These pieces of legislation before us make critical changes, including mandating that an impounded vehicle must be repaired and must be reinspected before it is released to the road.

Today we're creating the strongest limousine safety standards in the entire nation right here in the State of New York. And while we're advancing this aggressive agenda, we also

know that there's always more work to do, which is why we're also creating a task force that will further examine current limo regulations and safety training programs.

Thank you to our incredible

Majority Leader, Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins,

for making this a priority. Without her

leadership, we would not be here today, and we

would not be seeing so many progressive reforms

making their way to the Senate floor so

expeditiously this session.

I'd like to thank our colleagues in the Assembly for doing the right thing, working with our conference to enact legislation that complements what we put forward here in the Senate, and also to the Governor for signaling his partnership and commitment to signing these pieces of legislation into law.

I want to thank my colleagues for joining me and all of us in casting an aye vote on this historic day here in this chamber.

I hope it brings the families a bit of closure that your loved ones did not die in vain, but that their legacy will carry on and will undoubtedly save lives here in the State of

     Twenty people were killed in Schoharie County, in
23
     the heart of my Senate district, in a horrific
24

     limousine crash that literally made global
```

headlines.

You know, following the crash I spent time meeting with family members of the victims, the emergency responders who were called to the scene that day, most of which were from volunteer units. And I also met with investigators who were tasked with determining what happened and making some sense of what had occurred.

The consensus from all was that we need to, number one, better enforce our current laws and regulations and, number two, make meaningful revisions to our laws and regulations to truly improve limousine safety on our highways in New York State.

These bills that we are passing today are a direct result of the courageous input from the people who have experienced unimaginable grief and pain, and that is the families of our victims.

You know, I have such deep admiration and respect for the family members who have continued to keep the memory of their loved ones alive and have turned this grief and tragedy in their lives into something positive, and that

     is meaningful changes in the laws of the State of

In my district, where there is an emergency room at NYU Langone, emergency room doctors tell me that they'll often see individuals come in with split lips, broken noses, and cracked teeth. In fact, the physicians in the ER department see it so often, they call it "partition face." And partition face is when a passenger is sitting in the back seat of a taxicab, unbuckled, the cab makes a sudden stop, and they are flung headfirst into the plastic partition that's meant to protect the drivers. It's very dangerous.

Well, today we're finally taking steps here in the State of New York to require that everyone who rides in the back seat of a cab or a livery -- 8 years or older -- buckles up.

We know that wearing seat belts saves lives. Well, seat belt laws also save lives, Mr. President. I'm proud that we're taking this step and again want to commend Senator Kennedy for his leadership, along with

But I think what we could add to this piece of legislation to require having those seat belts and buckling them up is a requirement of the individual that drives these limousine vehicles, are part of these limousine companies — as they open up the doors and the individuals go in and sit down, that that limousine driver be required and mandated to tell everyone who is seated there, who they will be driving and responsible for in terms of driving the vehicle, no matter what the signs are, that the law is New York State says there must be seat belts here and you must have those seat belts on and attached.

And he will not put the key into the ignition and turn it until he sees all of them in their seats with the seat belt attached. Because there's a good chance if everyone is required -- before he starts that vehicle and drives -- having their seat belt attached, being notified this is the law, that they'll keep that seat belt on. Because we know the dangers to everybody if one, two or three people take those seat belts off. It not only impacts them, it impacts everybody else in that vehicle.

So I don't think it's a lot to ask 1 2 the person who's driving, no matter how many people are in it -- five, 10, 15 or 20 -- this is 3 4 the law, you have to be buckled, I have to see 5 you all buckled, and I can't put the key in the ignition, start it and begin to drive you on what 6 7 should be a wonderful day for you and a good 8 I don't think that's a lot to ask of a limousine driver. And I think there's a good 9 10 chance that people will keep those seat belts on if we start them out notifying them of the law 11 12 and the requirement that it doesn't move, this vehicle doesn't move until you're all attached 13 14 and I see that, and then he puts the key in and 15 drives. 16 So I would just suggest we think about that and look at that. I don't think 17 18 that's a lot to ask of someone who is driving people that are most precious to us. 19 20 Thank you.
