Both of these bills are unprecedented legislation which will strengthen oversight of two struggling school districts, Wyandanch and Hempstead. These measures lead to improved academic programs for students and greater fiscal accountability for parents and communities, while maintaining partnership with school boards and local school officials.

Monitors will be appointed by and accountable to the State Commissioner of Education as they work with local educators. Parents and other stakeholders will have an opportunity to have their voices heard in the process. And monitors will have clear lines of authority, involvement in planning and budget making, and will work with the local board of education to establish a positive path forward for each district.

The students in these districts have unfortunately waited too long for New York State to intervene. Programs have been reduced, and opportunities for children have been lost. These measures are the right balance of oversight, intervention and hope for the children that we

I rise in order to speak about these 11 12 particular bills, about Senator Brooks. I heard what he had to say in our conference, and I 13 14 support that wholeheartedly. Because when it 15 comes to our children's education, we want to make sure that the elected or appointed school 16 boards are doing the right thing. 17 18 And where the Senator, both either Senator Brooks or Senator Thomas from Hempstead, 19 20 are alleging that things need to be looked at from a monitor's point of view, I wholeheartedly 21 22 support that, especially when my colleagues are saying that the graduation rate is 31 percent or 23 around that, which is totally unacceptable to me 24

as someone that has been involved in education,

as the father of three girls.

And, more specifically, last year in the budgetary process I went to Rochester, I went to Schenectady, I went to Long Island, and I know what the conditions are. I do know this, that the State of New York owes our children statewide \$4 billion. In Rochester, New York, it was almost \$3,000 per student that the State of New York owed under the lawsuit and under the Campaign for Fiscal Equity, with the Foundation Aid formula.

Now, can you imagine -- I don't have a calculator on me -- 3,000 times 28,000? That's how much money Rochester is owed.
