PROCEEDINGS 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: The Senate will come to order. 3 4 I ask everyone present to please 5 rise and recite the Pledge of Allegiance. (Whereupon, the assemblage recited б the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.) 7 8 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Today 9 we have with us Reverend Dr. Leander Harding, 10 dean of the Cathedral of All Saints, Episcopal Diocese of Albany, and he will deliver today's 11 invocation. 12 REVEREND DR. HARDING: 13 Good 14 afternoon. Thank you for the privilege of 15 allowing me to do this. 16 I have two short prayers today. They're from the Book of Common Prayer, which is 17 18 the great tradition of the English-speaking 19 church. The first one is a prayer for our 20 country. Let us pray. 21 "Almighty God, Who hast given us 22 this good land for our heritage: We humbly beseech Thee that we may always prove ourselves a 23 people mindful of Thy favor and glad to do Thy 24 25 will.

"Bless our land with honorable 1 2 industry, sound learning, and pure manners. Save us from violence, discord, and confusion, from 3 4 pride and arrogancy, and from every evil way. 5 Defend our liberties, and fashion into one united people the multitudes brought hither out of many 6 7 kindreds and tongues. "Endue with the spirit of wisdom 8 9 those to whom in Thy name we entrust the 10 authority of government, that there may be justice and peace at home, and that, through 11 obedience to Thy law, we may show forth Thy 12 praise among the nations of the earth. 13 "In the time of prosperity, fill our 14 15 hearts with thankfulness, and in the day of trouble, suffer not our trust in Thee to fail. 16 "All this we ask through our Lord 17 18 Jesus Christ. Amen." 19 And this is a prayer for a State 20 Legislature. "O God, the fountain of wisdom, 21 22 Whose statutes are good and gracious, Whose law is truth: We beseech Thee so to guide and bless 23 the Legislature of this state, that it may ordain 24 25 for our governance only such things as please

Thee, to the glory of Thy name and the welfare of 1 2 Thy people, through Jesus Christ our Lord." May the blessing of God Almighty, 3 4 the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be upon 5 you. Amen. ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: 6 Reading 7 of the Journal. 8 THE SECRETARY: In Senate, Sunday, January 26, 2020, the Senate met pursuant to 9 10 adjournment. The Journal of Saturday, January 25, 2020, was read and approved. On 11 motion, Senate adjourned. 12 13 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Without 14 objection, the Journal stands approved as read. 15 Presentation of petitions. 16 Messages from the Assembly. Messages from the Governor. 17 18 Reports of standing committees. 19 Reports of select committees. 20 Communications and reports from 21 state officers. Motions and resolutions. 22 23 Senator Gianaris. SENATOR GIANARIS: Mr. President, 24 25 on behalf of Senator Parker, I wish to call up

Senate Print 4378, recalled from the Assembly, 1 2 which is now at the desk. ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: 3 The 4 Secretary will read. 5 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 1, Senate Print 4378, by Senator Parker, an act to б 7 amend the Election Law. 8 SENATOR GIANARIS: Move to 9 reconsider the vote by which the bill was passed. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: The Secretary will call the roll on reconsideration. 11 12 (The Secretary called the roll.) 13 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 52. 14 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: The 15 bill is restored to its place on the Third Reading Calendar. 16 17 SENATOR GIANARIS: I offer the 18 following amendments. ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: 19 The 20 amendments are received. 21 SENATOR GIANARIS: On behalf of 22 Senator Sanders, I move the following bill be discharged from its respective committee and 23 recommitted with instructions to strike the 24 25 enacting clause: Senate Bill 3032A.

It is 1 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: 2 so ordered. 3 SENATOR GIANARIS: At this time, 4 Mr. President, please take up previously adopted 5 Resolution 2394, by Senator Metzger, read its title only, and recognize Senator Metzger. 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: The 8 Secretary will read. 9 THE SECRETARY: Senate Resolution 10 2394, by Senator Metzger, congratulating the Delaware Academy Girls Cross Country Team upon 11 12 the occasion of capturing the New York State Public High School Athletic Association Class D 13 14 Championship. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Senator Metzger on the resolution. 16 SENATOR METZGER: Thank you, 17 18 Mr. President. 19 I'm so proud to sponsor this 20 legislative resolution congratulating the 21 Delaware Academy Girls Cross Country Team. They had been here earlier today and hoped to be here 22 in the chamber, but had to get back. They had a 23 ways to travel. 24 25 But this phenomenal group of young

athletes captured the New York State Public High 1 School Athletic Association Class D Championship 2 3 in November. To the praise and applause of their 4 excited fans during the New York State 5 Championship Meet in Plattsburgh, the Bulldogs were able to best their competitors and achieved 6 7 the most revered high school sporting accomplishment in the Empire State. 8 9 I'd like to congratulate each of the 10 members of the Delhi-based team individually: Rachel Blocker, Sienna Dorr, Gretel 11 12 Hilson-Schneider, Ellie Lees, Lucia Marsiglio, Camille Mueller, Cella Schnabel, Anna Tessier, 13 14 and Lonnie Weiss. I congratulate all of them. 15 As an amateur runner myself -- and I'm sure I am far slower than they are -- I'm 16 just so thrilled to be celebrating them today. 17 18 Cross country demands strenuous training, consistent mileage, and extraordinary 19 20 mental toughness. So I'd also like to applaud their athletic director, Jeffrey Ferrara, Head 21 22 Coach Skip Baxter and his expert coaching staff, Assistant Coaches Melissa Emilio and Lenny Mintz, 23 who worked very hard to hone the skills of this 24 25 championship team, teaching these outstanding

athletes lessons which will prove invaluable both 1 2 on and off the running trails. 3 And to the fine team of young women, 4 all of those characteristics that they brought to 5 athletics and to their admirable victory that were so important to their success -- hard work, 6 7 focus, perseverance, working together as a team and believing in themselves -- these skills will 8 9 help them in so many other ways in life. And I'm 10 very proud to represent each and every one of 11 them. 12 Congratulations to the team. It's very well deserved. 13 14 Thank you very much. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: The resolution was previously adopted on 16 January 14th. 17 18 Senator Gianaris. 19 SENATOR GIANARIS: At 20 Senator Metzger's request, that resolution is 21 open for cosponsorship. 22 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: The 23 resolution is open for cosponsorship. Should you choose not to be a cosponsor of the resolution, 24 25 please notify the desk.

1 Senator Gianaris. 2 SENATOR GIANARIS: Can you now 3 recognize Senator Sepúlveda for purposes of an introduction. 4 5 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Senator Sepúlveda. б 7 SENATOR SEPÚLVEDA: Thank you for 8 allowing me to make this introduction. 9 Today we have a group of young 10 ladies from the Bronx, Brooklyn, Queens, Manhattan -- specifically, Washington Heights --11 12 they're up there smiling and waving. They are here as part of the Life is Precious program that 13 is run by Communilife. 14 15 For those of you who don't know, I've spoken regularly about my mother, when I was 16 11 years old, committed suicide. She suffered 17 18 from depression. And unfortunately, she wasn't 19 diagnosed. At the time, the level of care that 20 you had back then -- this is 45 years ago --21 wasn't as available as it is today. And we still, as far back then, still deal with the 22 stigma of suicide and suicide ideation in this 23 country in a way that sometimes baffles me. 24 25 But today we have these 40 wonderful

young women who are joining us from the 1 2 Communilife's Life is Precious program. 3 Suicide amongst young Latinas is the 4 second biggest killer. About 15.3 percent of 5 young Latinas between the age of 12 and 17 successfully commit suicide, and a good portion 6 7 of them -- a larger portion engage in what's 8 called suicide ideation. 9 Now, the program was created by Life 10 is Precious, which was itself created in 2008 by what we call the Little Giant, Dr. Rosa Gil. 11 She 12 created the program after getting hundreds of 13 referrals from emergency rooms that weren't 14 prepared to deal with this specific issue and 15 this specific age group. She recognized the need for safe havens for young women where they could 16 be given support and skills needed to reclaim 17 18 their sense of worth, their limitless potential, along with a binding sisterhood that helps foster 19 20 a new pride in this bicultural background. Latina teens, as we've said, have 21 22 some of the highest rates of suicide, and this program has been fighting that. Life is Precious 23 is totally free for these deserving young women. 24 25 And thanks to the continued support of my

colleagues in this chamber, I would like the 1 2 members of this chamber to join me in welcoming 3 these young women from the city who are here 4 today. 5 And I want it to be known that Communilife has helped, has treated, has had over 6 7 300 young ladies participate in this program. And I'm proud to say that not a single one of the 8 participants has successfully committed suicide; 9 10 many of them have taken a different course in their lives and been very successful young women. 11 12 And I want you all to help me in welcoming them to this chamber today. Thank you. 13 (Standing ovation.) 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: To our guests from the Life is Precious program, I 16 welcome you on behalf of the Senate. We extend 17 18 to you all of the privileges and courtesies of this house while you're here. 19 20 Senator Gianaris. 21 SENATOR GIANARIS: Please take up 22 the reading of the calendar, Mr. President. This 16 act shall take effect immediately. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Call 18 the roll. (The Secretary called the roll.) 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Senator 21 Hoylman to explain his vote. 22 SENATOR HOYLMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. 23 24 I just wanted to note that this bill 25 would ensure that minors who are the victims of

1 sexual assault have access to a full 28-day 2 regimen of PEP. The PEP is post-exposure prophylaxis. It's a highly effective anti-HIV 3 4 drug that, when taken within 72 hours of a sexual 5 encounter, can prevent an HIV infection. The reason this bill is important is 6 7 that PEP can cost between \$600 and \$1000 for a 8 72-hour regimen, and missing a dose during that 9 28-day period can seriously limit the medicine's 10 ability to prevent HIV. 11 So I wanted to thank the NYCLU, Callen-Lorde, and the New York State Coalition 12 13 Against Sexual Assault for their efforts in support of this legislation, as well as my 14 15 colleagues for their support. 16 And I vote aye. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Senator 18 Hoylman to be recorded in the affirmative. 19 Announce the results. 20 THE SECRETARY: In relation to 21 Calendar Number 85, those Senators voting in the 22 negative are Senators Gallivan, Jacobs and Ortt. 23 Ayes, 57.
