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And happy to be here today under these very unique circumstances. And I reflect, during the time that I've had the privilege to serve in the Legislature in both houses, the solemn nature and the unique circumstances that we find ourselves in today.

So I applaud you and my colleagues for being here, and I harken back to how we achieved some legislative action after

September 11th. Different set of circumstances, but at the time we actually had a joint session of the Legislature in the State Assembly, presided over by Governor Pataki, then-Majority Leader Senator Bruno, and then Speaker Sheldon Silver. And it was amazing the things that got done in a very tight time frame.

Here we are today -- and I use the word "solemn" because I almost feel like I'm in a church, it's a house of worship because it's so quiet. And there's good reason for that.

So I want to thank Leader

Stewart-Cousins, Senator Gianaris, my colleague

Senator Griffo, and really all the Senators who

are here. They are here. Out of an abundance of
caution, we're not just walking -- we're not just

talking the talk, we're walking the walk.

And I do want to make a couple of comments about where I think our members are in relation to today. There is not a person who is not slightly apprehensive, maybe a little element of fear, a little element of understanding, misunderstanding, looking for guidance, looking for direction, hopefully looking for leadership -- and that can just be on a personal level involving your own family.

But here, as we sit in the seat of government, I think we take a more in-depth look at who we are and what our responsibilities are. And at a time of crisis -- and we are in a legitimate crisis -- people have expectations that their leaders that they have duly elected will act accordingly on their behalf.

I don't think I'm talking out of school; Mr. President, you and I chatted briefly about your daughter. You know, you're going to worry about your family, I'm going to worry about my family, and God knows you're going to worry about your daughter. And that's the way it should be.

And so we have to be reflective of

our constituents who are worrying, is my kid 1 coming home from school? How am I ever going to get a refund for going -- the kid going to 4 college? What am I going to do with my 5 elementary school children? What am I going to do about my constituents who are worried about 7 whether or not they can get to work, whether or not they're going to have a job, are they going 8 to be working remotely, what does that mean -and how does that all play out at a time where 11 people are really looking for their government to act like leaders? 12

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Now I'm going to speak personally. I believe, listening to my own staff and what I see, Governor Cuomo is making an extraordinary effort to provide leadership, 24/7 -- 26/7, 30/7, whatever it may be. He and his staff, and by extension all the state agencies, they are doing everything humanly possible -- literally -humanly possible and everything conceivable.

When I talk to a local hospital and find out that they're worried about whether or not they have surgical masks or they have the requisite gloves and they really want to take care of their patients, there isn't a person who

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works in government who isn't literally at this

                  So I laud, very clearly, the
     Governor for being extraordinarily proactive, for
 8
     being outspoken, for being a vintage and
 9

     quintessential New Yorker when he needs to be.
     But I do think people are really paying

     attention. Those daily briefings which are
     extended to us and which are extended to us, to
13
     our staff, are extraordinarily important. I

     believe that the Governor's staff is really
     endeavoring to interact with us in a way that is

     making everybody feel comfortable so we can

                  Every one of our colleagues -- and

     I'm sure it's the same for Leader

     Stewart-Cousins -- they're saying what are we
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doing, like what actions are we taking?

Today, and with this bill, I think there's a very clear recognition of what is being done, and it's finite. We're taking an issue and addressing that issue at this time because it's important and it means real things to real people. And this is addressing an acute problem in the right way in a limited capacity.

We will have time to have these other debates. And in fact, while it's seemingly innocuous, we actually are passing a debt service bill today. You and I both know that's the first step in the budget process. That's the first time Leader Stewart-Cousins can bring out something and say, We are moving along on the budget.

And ironically, people are going to start to pay attention to debt service more than they ever have. And rightfully so, because we're going to have a whole bunch of new debt because of the things that we're going to have to do.

I watch what goes on across the country, but I also watch, like everybody else, what's going on in Washington. And I believe the same that I described for the State of New York

1 is applicable to the President and our leaders 2 down in Washington -- my colleagues on 3 Long Island, Congressman Peter King, Congressman 4 Zeldin, many of our colleagues across the State 5 of New York. We all have a laser-like focus on how can we help the people we represent and do it 6 7 in a way and shape and form that they can understand and that makes a difference in their 8 9 life. 10 So it's every level of government -town, county, village, whatever it may be -- the 11 school district, the water district, the 12 sanitation district. Who's picking up the 13 14 garbage, all those types of things. But at the 15 federal level, Vice President Pence and the 16 federal administration, they are looking at major stimuluses to provide relief to people, 17 18 small-business owners, not-for-profits, nursing 19 homes, who are not only worried about their 20 supplies but whether or not they can meet 21 payroll. 22 So I want to compliment this legislative body. I want to compliment the 23 24 Legislature. And gosh knows we have a ton more 25 work to do. But when the Governor of the State

of New York and the President of the United 1 2 States are in sync and acting in a bipartisan way, that inures to the benefit of the millions 3 4 of people in this state that we still continue to 5 call the Empire State. We have more work to do in front of 6 7 And I've been here a long time; I've never been in a chamber like this. I'm looking at my 8 four colleagues here. We are literally 9 10 representative of every one of our members -- who genuinely want to be here, because they believe 11 12 in what they do. 13 And I'm going to just close, again, 14 by saying I support these bills. And we'll have 15 much more time for debate on other policy issues, it's just not going to be today. But this 16 17 provides relief at an appropriate time, in an 18 appropriate way. And I thank the Governor for all the 19 20 things that I said, and I'll repeat them once Those briefings and all the information 21

goes a long way, a long way in allaying some of the fears and concerns of the public.

Mr. President, I vote aye.

obviously, you know, a tragedy, but for some reason, you know, that happened, we went through the pain and the grief and then we were able to get up the next day and say, let's go fight every day. With the unpredictability of what we are doing, it's a day that regardless of what, we have to get up and we have to fight.

And I thank our Governor for getting up every day and fighting, and for fighting for all of us here in New York but, on a broader level, everyone in the nation.

And yes, we have these same cooperative measures from our Congresspeople, our Senators. I've spoken with both Senator Schumer and Senator Gillibrand and our Congresspeople, Eliot Engel and Nita Lowy and so on -- I won't go through all of them. But the reality is that every single one of us are fighting for every single one of us.

My daughter had to be put on leave -- you know, they're staggering. My son is -- well, my son-in-law, working from home, my children working from home. Daycare center, preschool closed. Every aspect of our lives are changed and changed probably for a very, very

long time.

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So to step up with courage to pass a bill today that deals with the coronavirus emergency, to pass a bill today that deals with a our budget emergency, I hope assures every single person in our state that we are at work and we will not rest until we are able to assuage the concerns of the small businesses, to make sure that our kids are getting the education, even if it's from a distance, and we have our essential workers getting the support they need on the front lines no matter where they are -obviously, in the hospitals, but even in our communities, making sure that the day-to-day things happen, that we and certainly our constituents who have to maybe stay away can depend on going forward despite this crisis.

New Yorkers are strong. New York leads all the time. And I'm happy to have a bipartisan communication with my colleague Senator Flanagan -- and thank you, Senator Griffo -- and certainly with Senator Gianaris, to represent the highest aspirations of all of us to meet this crisis head on, to overcome it, to do a responsible budget that takes into consideration

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the needs of all of us, and to stand every time
