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SENATOR GIANARIS: 1 Thank you, 2 Mr. President. 3 Thank you to my colleagues for 4 supporting this important proposal. 5 We are one year from the beginning of COVID impacting our state, and too many people 6 7 have passed and gotten sick because we didn't take adequate steps in that time to protect the 8 frontline workers, people who continued to go to 9 10 work both because they had to, to provide for their families, and also to keep our communities 11 12 running during the pandemic. 13 This bill today would require strict 14 guidelines that employers would have to put into 15 place at their places of employment to make sure 16 that their workers are protected against airborne diseases like the coronavirus -- standards as it 17 18 relates to PPE, air filtration, social 19 distancing, et cetera, that for too many was 20 lacking over the last several months. 21 It also empowers workers, through a 22 workplace safety committee made up of employees, to monitor and report failures to comply with 23 these regulations. 24 25 And so this was a bill that came

Here we are, one year later -- one year later and more than a month since the Attorney General's report on nursing homes that confirmed for me and many of my colleagues on both sides of the aisle that it is long past time to end the Governor's emergency powers.

Since the AG's report, it's been an avalanche of sad and concerning news. The loss of more than 15,000 nursing home and long-term-care residents to COVID-19. The deliberate withholding of information by the Department of Health. Ongoing federal investigations. And amidst all of this, small businesses are still hurting. People are still unemployed, families are still struggling, and kids are still not back in school full-time.

Decisions about how and when businesses can operate, who can get the vaccine, and where and when -- this is about decisions on whether families can see their moms and dads in nursing homes, when and if students can go back to school five days a week.

We as lawmakers must have a say in these decisions. The Legislature must help lead

You know, if someone is hiring someone to watch their children, are 6 7 they going to have to give them that four hours 8 paid time off? 9 But at the end of the day I've 10 decided to support this bill, mostly because of the tremendous lack of vaccine that we have here 11 12 in New York State and the way the Governor has handled the rollout of this vaccine distribution. 13 He's made it political. 14 15 I have people in my district driving hours to get a vaccination, taking whatever 16 appointment might be available, no matter how far 17 18 away it is, so they can get this much-needed 19 vaccination. 20 So while I really am concerned about the impact on our small businesses, this is 21 22 really important because of the way the Governor has handled the rollout of this vaccine 23 distribution. We cannot really afford to let 24

someone pass up an open appointment. It's like

But we're taking steps to make that better. We're now taking steps with this bill to make it easier for people to be able to take the time that they need to go get their vaccine, both of their doses if they're taking a vaccine that requires two doses, to be able to have time to recuperate.

And we are doing this in the same way that we have acted on previous issues to give people paid leave for other important health matters -- most recently and most notably, our cancer screening bill that we passed two years ago.

So we are using the same model that we've used in the past. This is something that is tried and true for both employees and

employers in the State of New York. And I think 1 2 it's going to go a long way to help people get the vaccines that we need. 3 4 And thankfully, over the last couple 5 of weeks we have seen a significant uptick in the number of vaccines that have been shipped to 6 7 New York. We have seen a significant uptick in the numbers of vaccinations. We're still not 8 where we want to be, and I'll agree with you on 9 10 that, but we've certainly made progress over the last couple of weeks -- thankfully, in that we 11 12 have an administration in Washington that's listening to us. 13 14 I vote aye. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT BENJAMIN: Senator Gounardes to be recorded in the 16 affirmative. 17 18 Senator Lanza to explain his vote.
