And I would like to express my sincere condolences to her 13 family and loved ones. 14 15 She was born in the Bronx, and she dedicated her life to community service. In 1982 16 she was elected to the New York State Assembly, 17 18 and she served with distinction for 27 years, becoming the first African-American Speaker 19 20 Pro Tem for the New York State Assembly. In 2009 she left the Assembly to 21 22 serve as deputy bureau president under Ruben Díaz, Jr. 23 And she has been, to so many of us, 24 25 a mentor, a friend, someone with tremendous

kindness and grace. And she was a true pillar of leadership in our community, always with a ready smile, with good advice, and there to help others.

And those of us who are in elected office in the Bronx, we owe her such a tremendous debt of gratitude, and we stand on the shoulders of such a great individual.

And she did truly dedicate all of her life to the betterment of her community, to ensuring that seniors and children had access to the resources that they need.

And she was also one of the most effective and truest coalition builders that I've ever seen before. And at a time like today, where we often find ourselves so stratified, it's so refreshing to have known someone who really found common ground on so many important issues and was able to build upon that for the betterment of our society.

So it's with a very heavy heart that I'm here today to memorialize such a dear friend of myself and of my father, who recently retired from Congress, José Serrano. And we're all here to offer our gratitude and our sincerest

     proclaiming the month of May as Lyme Disease
```

Awareness Month here in New York.

We are so profoundly lucky to have such a beautiful host of natural resources and many incredible outdoor activities. But with that comes the real danger of Lyme disease and tick-borne illnesses. If you live in upstate

New York or really anywhere across the state, we all know someone who has been touched by

Lyme disease and has their lives changed dramatically forever.

This is something that we need to raise more awareness for, especially as we have more and more people discovering our incredible outdoor areas and our natural resources. As we have more in-state tourism and more people coming to our outdoor areas, we have to make sure that we keep each other safe and we keep ourselves safe.

A real danger with Lyme disease is that an average of nearly half a million

Americans is estimated to have received a diagnosis of Lyme disease each year from 2010 to 2018. That's a huge number, and I believe only growing.

And so I am incredibly proud today

1 to stand here to raise awareness so that we can 2 keep more and more people safe across New York. And I thank this body and this house for letting 3 4 this resolution come to the floor. 5 Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: 6 Senator 7 Serino on the resolution. SENATOR SERINO: 8 Thank you, Madam President. 9 10 And thank you, Senator Hinchey, for 11 bringing this resolution to the floor today. 12 The more champions that we have committed to tackling ticks, the better for all 13 New Yorkers. Since I first brought this 14 15 resolution to the floor -- it was five years ago -- awareness for Lyme and tick-borne diseases 16 has risen tremendously. And I'm sure we can all 17 18 agree; we see it in our interactions, we see it on social media, TV, and we see it even in the 19 20 press. And it's really been fantastic to see how 21 far we've come. 22 But I attended an event recently that reminded me of just how far we still need to 23 go to better protect New Yorkers and to fund 24 25 research initiatives that would help improve

testing and treatment options for thousands that have been impacted.

So the event I went to was called Live for Lyme, and it was at a local gym. It was about a young man, he was a husband and a father, who died by suicide this February after living with neurological Lyme. And his wife is a licensed clinical social worker. She was not familiar, as were a lot of other people that are in the mental health field, with neurological Lyme.

He was diagnosed in November of 2019, and by February 2020 he had to take a leave from work. He couldn't remember how to drive to his job. He couldn't verbalize words that he was thinking in his mind. So by February of 2021, he decided to take his life and he died by suicide, sadly.

So to hear stories like this just absolutely breaks your heart. And there's so much of a disconnect still that we really need the money for research and education and, like I said, testing and treatment.

So May is Lyme Disease Awareness
Month, but it's also Mental Health Awareness

Month. And many may not even know that this connection exists, as I just talked about. We have a duty to ensure that no family has to suffer the way this family has. And that starts by ensuring that our state is leading the way when it comes to the funding for research, education and prevention initiatives.

For too long now Lyme and tick-borne disease has taken a back seat to other priorities. As we work to rebuild and recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, there has never been a more perfect time to give Lyme the attention that it truly deserves.

And when you think about this, too, the symptoms that are associated with COVID and those associated with Lyme and tick-borne diseases are incredibly similar. And with New Yorkers taking to the outdoors like never before, we cannot afford to take any steps back in this fight.

So while May may be the official

Lyme Disease Awareness Month, I hope all of us

will redouble our efforts and do everything we

can to raise awareness not just today, but every

day.

On March 13th, Travis was working in a cornfield, and the machine that he was operating had a mechanical issue. He got off the tractor, he went to try and address that mechanical issue, and with his leg he was pushing on some cornstalks and that machine then sucked the lower portion of his body into the machine.

Travis, with his legs caught in this machine, laid in that field for more than

45 minutes screaming for help until his father,

Mike, came and tried to help. Travis, because
his father was so distraught, called 911 himself
and asked the dispatcher to ensure that they sent
a four-wheel-drive vehicle because he was in the
middle of a cornfield, but also asked them to
send a medical helicopter.

And I think much to everyone's surprise in the State of New York, that medical helicopter couldn't in fact transfuse blood. And Travis knew that he had been bleeding so bad for 45 minutes that he needed a blood transfusion.

And by the grace of God, a New York helicopter was not available, and they sent

1 Guthrie Air from Pennsylvania to help Travis. 2 And Travis attributes that blood transfusion with the fact that he is still here today. Had he not 3 4 gotten that transfusion from the medics on that 5 helicopter, he recognized and understood that he probably wouldn't be here with us today. 6 7 Ken Whitmore is the fire chief in Smithville Flats. He said: "In my 20 years of 8 service, it was the worst call that I've ever 9 10 been on." When I spoke to Travis about this 11 12 particular issue and learned about his accident, he said to me, "Fred, I still have both of my 13 arms. I'm still able to hug my children. 14 15 still able to hug my wife. Use my tragedy so that we can save lives in the State of New York." 16 Just as I close, I want to thank a 17 18 couple of people. I want to thank the Farm 19

couple of people. I want to thank the Farm

Bureau. I want to thank the Association of

Counties for their support of this particular

bill. I want to thank a very close friend of

mine back in my district, Judi Whittaker, who has

months ago.

If real repeal had been passed, we wouldn't be having this conversation today. In fact, the reason we're having this conversation today exposes that that bill was nothing more than a fraud to our public.

If anyone here has a two-year-old toddler, you'll know what I'm talking about. I'm the proud father of a 5-year-old, a 4-year-old, and an 18-month-old, so I've been through this and I know a lot about 2-year-olds. And what's clear to me is the Governor's latest order that requires 2-year-olds to wear masks at summer camps and in daycare was written by someone who has no clue what it's like to care for a 2-year-old.

This is utterly nonsensical and an unreasonable demand that's made on our childcare providers -- and parents -- who have already had a tremendously hard job this year and continue to struggle. Now our childcare providers in our camps and so many others are going to spend tremendous portions of their day fighting to put masks back on little kids who already have a very, very low risk to begin with.

Worse is that this policy contradicts one that the Office of Children and Family Services right here in New York announced last June, on June 26th. That policy recommended but did not require masks to be worn by children in daycare and day camp settings.

That's very interesting to me, because what's happened since that June 26th order? Well, providers and employers have been vaccinated, parents and caregivers have been vaccinated, and infection rates are steadily on the decline. We got the latest infection rates from the Governor just today in a press conference that he held talking about just how low they are.

Large entertainment venues, restaurants, amusement parks and everything else has reopened. The CDC has rescinded mask mandates for vaccinated individuals. And finally, after some pressure, our Governor has accepted those standards.

In short, things are way better than they were on last June 26th when that order was originally issued. And I remind you that masks were not required for children in childcare

1 settings back then in June. 2 Why would Governor Cuomo choose now to mandate masks on our toddlers? It makes 3 4 absolutely no sense, Madam President. It's not 5 about public health, it's about control. And why would this body give this 6 7 type of control to someone like our Governor, 8 who's under investigation for every form of corruption and by every imaginable law 9 10 enforcement source. Last week, in fact, when our 11 Governor was asked at a press conference about 12 the outrage people feel about him taking a 13 14 \$5 million payment for writing a book about the 15 pandemic that killed 50,000 New Yorkers, his reply was: "That's stupid. Next question." 16 Well, when someone asks me about 17 18 this mask mandate for 2-year-olds, my reply is 19 the same: That's stupid. Next question. 20 For these reasons, Madam President, 21 I strongly urge you to reconsider the ruling, and 22 I urge my colleagues to support this commonsense amendment. Our kids are counting on us. 23 Thank you, Madam President. 24 25 ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: Thank

ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: 3 The 4 appeal has been made and recognized, and Senator 5 Griffo may be heard. SENATOR GRIFFO: 6 Thank you, 7 Madam Chair. 8 I believe that the amendment before the house is germane, as it deals with the 9 10 subject at hand of antibias and human rights. For over 2,000 years the Jewish 11 12 people have been the targets of hatred. horrors and tragedy that history has shown us 13 14 over the last century show how we must condemn this antisemitic behavior. It must be denounced, 15 confronted and combated. 16 17 Sadly, we continue to see 18 antisemitic threats, attacks and vandalism not 19 only here in New York State, but across our 20 country and throughout the world. Just recently 21 the New York City Police Department's Hate Crimes 22 Task Force is investigating a Jewish man reportedly assaulted in Times Square. At the 23 24 same time, in Los Angeles, police are

investigating several Jewish people, simply

dining at a restaurant, who had bottles thrown at them. Synagogues in Arizona, Illinois and

New York have been vandalized.

And we've seen this increase significantly in just recent weeks. The Anti-Defamation League, a Jewish civil rights group, received over 193 reports of antisemitic incidents in just the last week. And between May 7th and the 14th of May, there were 17,000 tweets that used a variation of the phrase "Hitler was right."

These deplorable threats and actions that we continue to witness are reprehensible.

They're unacceptable. They're inexcusable. And they continue to spread fear throughout the Jewish community. Those who commit such acts should be held accountable for their actions.

The human rights statute that we have in our state prohibits discrimination of New Yorkers for the purposes of age, race, color, creed, national origin, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, marital status, military status and disability. This amendment would ensure that we have additional provisions that we can protect those, particularly of the Jewish
