trainers in New York State and also that they

become mandatory reporters of child abuse.

Which is really important because many athletic trainers are the only medical contact for a lot of young people as they are on sports teams and that sort of thing, so this piece of that legislation is really important.

So they're here to remind us how important athletic trainers are for our young people in particular -- how we want kids to participate in sports, we want them to have active, healthy lives, and we want them to do so in a safe manner that can carry through to their entire lives. And athletic trainers are at the forefront of helping young people, particularly, and professional athletes do their jobs in a safe way that is sustainable and helps them then have healthy lives throughout their lives.

So I want to thank our guests for being here and representing athletic trainers with us, and I ask you to welcome them to the Senate. Thank you.

There are a lot of really good bills 1 2 on the agenda today, and I just want to thank all my colleagues for bringing them forward and 3 4 everyone who supports these bills, because 5 transparency and accountability in government are absolutely critical. 6 7 Thank you. I vote aye. ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: 8 Senator May to be recorded in the affirmative. 9 10 Senator Reichlin-Melnick to explain his vote. 11 12 SENATOR REICHLIN-MELNICK: Thank you very much, Madam President. 13 Thanks to Senator May for her kind 14 words as well. 15 16 This is an important step in 17 restoring transparency and accountability for 18 New York State. Our former Governor stripped 19 away, over many years, the power of our 20 State Comptroller to review and authorize 21 contracts before they're entered into. 22 And so what happens when you take 23 away that audit power? You get corruption. get the Buffalo Billion. You get contracts 24

entered into with political cronies, with

friends, with people that should never have gotten a contract with the state, but they did, because there was no review.

And so this bill just says we're going to go back to the way it was about a decade ago, before we started taking those powers away from the State Comptroller, and to give his office back the power to review contracts and approve them before they go into effect.

That is a simple thing that we can do. It is going to make a big difference in making the people of New York have confidence that our contracting in New York State is fair, is open, is transparent, and that contracts will go to people that deserve it and who can actually deliver the goods and services that they promise, and not to political cronies or patronage appointments.

So I proudly support this bill, and I thank our Senate Majority Leader for bringing it to a vote.

They are allowed to punch 21 through all that, to ignore the destruction of 22 natural habitats, things like water resources, important things like that, in order to expedite 23 the siting of renewable energy. 24 25 ORES needs to go away, just like the

Madam President. 1 2 This bill would make sure that our 3 NYCHA residents who are denied services that they 4 are actually paying for be made whole. There has 5 been a rash of outages, utility outages -- heat, hot water and so on -- at our NYCHA facilities 6 7 throughout the city. And what a lot of people 8 don't realize is that the rent that the tenants 9 of NYCHA pay includes the cost of utilities. 10 So now we're at a point where they're being denied the services but still 11 paying. And the least we can do is make sure 12 that they are made whole, that if they are paying 13 for a service they're not getting, that they be 14 15 refunded that amount. 16 That's what this bill would do. It's a small step but an important one to help 17 18 make the residents of NYCHA facilities whole. 19 And I appreciate my colleagues' support for this 20 bill. 21 Thank you, Madam President. This bill will memorialize and 6 7 remember Firefighter Jared Lloyd by renaming a stretch of New York State Route 45 in the Town of 8 Ramapo in his honor. 9 10 Jared was only 35 years old last year on March 23, 2021, when he responded, one of 11 the first volunteer firefighters on the scene, to 12 a horrific fire that had broken out at the 13 Evergreen Court Adult Home in the Village of 14 15 Spring Valley. 16 This was a facility that housed over 100 seniors and people with special needs, and it 17 18 was engulfed in flames when he arrived. 19 Heroically, he went in, along with so many of his 20 fellow firefighters, and they saved 111 out of 112 people from that facility, which is almost a 21 22 miracle. 23 Tragically, Jared got trapped in the facility, and he lost his life. He was 35 years 24 25 He had two young children, one of whom

turned six the day after the fire.

And his loss has been felt by
everybody in Rockland County, by volunteer
firefighters from throughout the tri-state area
and New York State. And so this is a fitting
monument to his legacy as a hero who didn't have
to do this. He volunteered. We don't have paid
firefighters in Rockland County; we have
volunteers who put their lives on the line and
don't even ask to be paid for it.

And he did that, and he saved and helped his fellow firefighters save over 100 residents from this home. And so I am proud that we will be renaming part of Route 45, just a mile from where that incident took place, in his honor.

We stood with his parents earlier this year, Assemblyman Ken Zebrowski and I and others who are introducing this legislation. I know all of my Rockland colleagues are in support. And this is the least we can do. We've taken action in the last couple of weeks on fire safety and hope to take more. This is one simple thing that we will do to recognize so that Firefighter Jared Lloyd's memory will never be

This is, in my mind, going to be referred to as the Velmanette Montgomery New York YouthBuild Act.

For years and years during her excellent service here in the State Senate,
Senator Montgomery was a champion of the New York
State YouthBuild Act. New York State YouthBuild,
for those who don't know, is a not-for-profit
organization that provides assistance and a path
forward for individuals, young folks from the
ages of 16 to 24, that are at risk, so to speak.
And these programs have proven to be nothing
short of masterful.

Earlier in the session I was on a Zoom with many members of the YouthBuild organization from throughout the state and hearing so many of the stories of these young people and how they were able to turn their lives around because of an opportunity. The opportunity that this program gave them showed them that people do care about them, that people do in fact believe in them.

And that when you give someone an opportunity and a chance to be able to grow,

those of us in the State of New York, those of us 1 2 gardeners, to use a metaphor, Madam President, we have to water the seeds so that they grow 3 4 properly. 5 The New York State YouthBuild Act gives an opportunity for all of us in the State 6 7 Legislature to be those gardeners and sow the 8 seeds for the future generations. 9 I'm hopeful that the Assembly will 10 follow suit in passing this bill. I'm grateful to all of my colleagues in this august body for 11 12 being able to support this piece of legislation year after year. And we should do this one for 13 our children. 14 15 Thank you, Madam President. obviously a top priority. And we all know that mistakes, errors were made.

But -- so my understanding with this bill is this notifies families, residents and other concerned stakeholders of an outbreak of some kind of infectious disease. But there is already a federal regulation which requires this notification.

Could you just tell me the difference here?

SENATOR SKOUFIS: Yes. Through you, Madam President.

The difference -- so yes, existing law requires -- and this is pursuant to federal guidelines. Existing law requires that facilities notify family members or some other designee of an infection of a resident and provide an update at least once per day to that family member or designee as to how things are going, the status of that resident.

What this bill does is it extends the notification requirement to the family members or designees of the other residents in the facility, not just the individual who is infected.

1 And, you know, as you rightly 2 pointed out, there was -- there was mass tragedy 3 throughout nursing homes and other places of 4 congregation during the height of the pandemic. 5 And I believe and the Assembly sponsor believes that it is of utmost importance that the other 6 7 residents and family members be advised of when 8 there is an infection because they could be 9 infected. 10 And so this isn't just an issue that impacts the one individual, it impacts the entire 11 12 facility. 13 SENATOR BORRELLO: Madam President, 14 will the sponsor continue to yield. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: Does the sponsor yield? 16 17 SENATOR SKOUFIS: Yes. 18 ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: The sponsor yields. 19 20 SENATOR BORRELLO: Through you, 21 Madam President. 22 So obviously infection is a broad 23 So -- and in the federal regulation you're saying is that it notifies the family of 24 25 the person that is infected, but now we're going

1 to extend this to everyone. 2 So are there any requirements -like if one person at the facility gets the 3 4 common cold, we notify everybody that this one 5 person has the common cold? SENATOR SKOUFIS: So no. 6 A common 7 cold is not generally classified as an infectious 8 disease by health regulators. And so if it's 9 something like the common cold, no, there 10 wouldn't have to be some notification. This is targeted more towards 11 infection like we saw during the pandemic. 12 13 I will note, however, that this does not require, you know, the facility to sign up 14 15 with some call center and make, you know, a 16 hundred, 500 calls to family members. This can be done -- and it's actually specified in the 17 18 bill language -- with a click of a mouse. 19 could be email notification, electronic 20 notification. And so it's quite simple to get 21 the word out to those family members. 22 But to answer your question, no, 23 this wouldn't cover things like a common cold. SENATOR BORRELLO: Madam President, 24 25 if the sponsor will continue to yield.

SENATOR BORRELLO: My understanding is that the federal regulation requires notification by 5:00 p.m. the next calendar day. But this requirement is by -- within 12 hours.

So does that require, then, a nursing home to give the same notification twice to the same people?

SENATOR SKOUFIS: Through you,

Madam President. If you're looking at the

overlap here, the overlap, even if it does apply,

would be very, very narrow. We're talking about

one family member.

And so, you know, if you have a hundred residents in a nursing home facility, yes, the current statute does require that by 5:00 p.m. that notification has to be made to that family member of the infected resident.

This new legislation would require notification to the other 99. If the facility wants to make another notice to the one, alongside the 99, that's their prerogative. I don't think it's all that cumbersome to add one more email address to an email that goes out to the other 99.

SENATOR SKOUFIS: Through you,
Madam President. I certainly appreciate that sentiment.

But what I can tell you is that over the course of the 20-plus hours of hearings that my committee, the Investigations Committee, held jointly with the Health Committee in 2020, we heard from a whole host of family members who had loved ones in nursing homes who were panicked not because of what you're describing, but were panicked because they were not being told what was going on in the nursing home where their loved one was.

And so to the contrary of what you're saying, I think you actually reduce the panic if you are providing the information to those family members that they can best respond -- however they think is appropriately -- and to take care of and protect their loved ones from an infection that might be in a nursing home.

SENATOR BORRELLO: Madam President,

1 will the sponsor continue to yield? 2 ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: Does the sponsor yield? 3 4 SENATOR SKOUFIS: Yes. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: The 6 sponsor yields. 7 SENATOR BORRELLO: So there is a 8 requirement in this bill that you have to create 9 special quarantine, if you will, areas. 10 those special quarantine areas are, according to the bill, for people that are not just infected 11 12 but are suspected of being infected. 13 Now, the nursing home industry would 14 call that cohorting: We're going to take people 15 and put into them into a specific area in a 16 cohort. 17 But when the language says suspected 18 of being infected, aren't we putting people at 19 risk of being quarantined with people that 20 actually are infected, being -- not being 21 confirmed of having the infection? 22 SENATOR SKOUFIS: Through you, 23 Madam President, that's a fair question. And first of all, I think it's 24 25 important to note that most good-acting nursing

1 homes, most good-acting facilities already have 2 something like this in place. They have an infectious disease plan in place. They have 3 4 space within their facility to make sure that 5 folks who are infected are quarantined from the rest of the residents. 6 7 And so really what this bill looks to do is bring up the bad-acting facilities to 8 the level that the good-acting facilities are 9 10 already at. And so look, you know, if there 11 is -- if a resident is suspected of being 12 infected with a disease and the facility is 13 concerned about cohorting, as you describe it, 14 15 then the facility would be right to make sure 16 that that person is not cohorting, they're in maybe another space, what have you, until there 17 18 is confirmation that the individual is indeed 19 infected. 20 SENATOR BORRELLO: Madam President, will the sponsor continue to yield? 21 ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: 22 Does the sponsor yield? 23 SENATOR SKOUFIS: 24 Yes. 25 ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: The

sponsor yields.

SENATOR BORRELLO: We certainly want to ensure that the bad actors, those that aren't following those guidelines -- because there already are guidelines: CDC guidelines, best practices.

But you said something important now. You said, well, perhaps they could just move those people into a different facility, those that are suspected versus confirmed. But the legislation doesn't say that. The legislation says they will be cohorted together.

So what part of this legislation would ensure that the bad actors especially -- because we're concerned about the bad actors -- didn't do that and didn't just go ahead and follow the law to the letter of the law and put potentially infected people in with confirmed infected?

SENATOR SKOUFIS: Through you,

Madam President. I first just want to clarify or

correct -- I did not say -- I would not suggest

that they be moved to a different facility, as

you just mentioned. We're talking about the same

facility, just a different space. Right?

And it's important to note that 1 2 there's nothing in this legislation that constricts the facility to just having one space 3 to deal with individuals like we're describing. 4 5 And so I don't see any restrictions that would -- that would prohibit a facility from 6 7 making sure that suspected infected residents are not inappropriately cohorting with confirmed 8 infected residents. 9 10 SENATOR BORRELLO: Madam President, on the bill. 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT PERSAUD: Senator Borrello on the bill. 13 SENATOR BORRELLO: 14 First of all, 15 thank you, Senator Skoufis. 16 Again, I think we can all agree that our heart's in the right place on here. We want 17 18 to protect those, especially after the tragedy 19 that we saw -- unnecessary tragedy, I might add, 20 from a bad decision by our former governor to send COVID-positive patients back into nursing 21 22 homes. 23 And I think that unfortunate decision by someone who couldn't see the light of 24 25 day beyond his own ego is why we all now have to

stand here and debate bills like this.

But that being said, we already have regulations that ask our nursing homes to do certain things. We already have best practices. And my concern here is not necessarily this being duplicative. You're right, if they want to notify it twice, that's fine.

But are we being clear? Are we following best practices and CDC guidelines? And importantly, are we following the patients' rights? These patients have rights. And I am very concerned because there really isn't a real clear definition as to how those cohorts should be made up.

We want to protect folks. But the government coming in after the fact is not going to solve the problem. The number-one concern for our nursing home operators is to protect their patients. We already burden them with all kinds of useless reports that nobody reads that have to be delivered every single day, and that takes away from the ability to do their job, to care for the residents, to care for those folks that are so vulnerable.

So now we're going to say one more

time let's put another brick on the back of those folks that care for our most vulnerable residents. And that's why I'm concerned here.

We want to protect those folks. We want an obligation, that the government says "this is what you have to do." But they know what they're supposed to do. Because if we really knew what was best for the residents of nursing homes, we wouldn't be having -- wasting time on ridiculous daily reports that nobody reads. We wouldn't have them wasting time on Monday-morning quarterbacking things that the government made them do.

I trust that those folks in this industry are in there because they care. I think we have a tremendous shortage of those who can and are willing to care for our most vulnerable citizens. We know we are short on nurses, on nursing aides, on everyone, really, that works in a nursing home. So we should be very careful and cautious when we start to take and put another brick on the back of those people that are charged with caring for our vulnerable loved ones.
