                   The nation is currently facing a
22
      student loan debt crisis, as more than 44 million
      Americans owe at least $1.7 trillion in student
23
      loan debt backed by the federal government, plus
24
25
      another $128 billion in private student loans.
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New York's student loan borrowers hold an estimated \$100 billion in outstanding education debt, of which \$10.6 billion is private student loan debt.

Over 90 percent of undergraduate private student loans were cosigned. These private student loans require at least one borrower to be creditworthy, currently employed, having a minimum credit score and, in most recent years, meeting other criteria such as debt-to-income ratio.

Many undergraduates would not meet these requirements. Today, most of these student loans for undergraduates must be cosigned by someone like a grandparent or a parent. In the past two decades, consumers aged 60 and up became the fastest-growing group of student loan borrowers.

Nationwide, there have been thousands of complaints to state and federal regulators from cosigners who are unable to access documentation on their cosigned loan, receive accurate information on loan payment processing or notice of loan delinquency, or were denied the right to cosign the release.

1 According to the CFPB report, 2 student loan servicers rejected 90 percent of borrowers who applied for cosigner release. 3 4 Through stringent payment requirements, limited 5 notice of eligibility, and really bad company practices, private student loan servicers created 6 7 challenges for borrowers seeking cosigner 8 release. And several attorney generals have sued over these provisions and are just now beginning 9 10 to win on the merits. 11 This bill that we're going to pass 12 today mandates disclosures that are more robust, prohibits restrictions that would permanently bar 13 cosigners from release, bars lenders from 14 15 requiring more than 12 months of consecutive on-time payments for cosigner release, and grants 16 borrowers appeal rights when a lender denies a 17 18 request for such a release. 19 This bill is a step in the right 20 direction, giving protections to parents and grandparents, and I urge all my colleagues to 21 vote in the affirmative. 22

And if there are any errors in the documents, the Supreme Court e-filing -- with the clerk, if you go in person, they will tell you what the specific error is, they'll allow you to correct the error, and even if you paid beforehand, they will still give you credit for those documents and allow you to resubmit a document.

On e-file, they will put a notation telling you that your document has been rejected. Then you call the clerk, and the clerk will explain to you why the document was rejected, and then they'll accept it and they won't -- they

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won't require you to pay a second fee.
