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There are over 260,000 New Yorkers who identify with the recovery community and recovery movement. At this very moment, millions of New Yorkers are suffering from substance abuse addiction.

I thank Dr. Angelia Smith-Wilson and Friends of Recovery New York for bringing these voices to Albany today in our State Capitol for Recovery Day.

It is my honor to chair the committee that I chair, Alcoholism & Substance Abuse. But more importantly, it's to use my position of power to fight for those struggling with addiction. The numbers of overdoses are soaring at an alarming rate. Every 90 seconds a New Yorker dies from a overdose. That is more than car accidents, suicide and homicides combined.

When dealing with addiction, historically the road to recovery has never been easy. And to make matters worse, addiction is repeatedly met with denial, misunderstandings and stigma.

Of course one of our main goals is to combat drug addiction and prevent overdoses.

But what about those living on a daily basis with substance abuse issues? Our mission is also about meeting people where they are and treating them with dignity and respect and offering a path to recovery through community resources, because they are part of our community.

The services and support we see today were hard-fought, but without a doubt there is so much more to be done. There is not one single solution to end addiction. And our loved ones in the recovery community know that compassionate care is multifaceted, taking a great deal of research, investment and love.

This resolution recognizes the journey this community has endured on the road to recovery. The path to healing has needed understanding, courage and a will to end the crisis that continues to plague our communities. This resolution honors all the brave individuals who took the first step on the road to recovery.

But the road to recovery is not one you take alone. Recovery day belongs to the entire recovery community: Treatment providers, medical professionals, sponsors, friends, family members and loved ones who give so much of their

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lives to helping those find that first step to

Madam President, I'm asking if we can give the courtesy of the Senate to our hero, the grandson of a great hero, Mr. Mandela, who is in our midst this afternoon. With your
