      new lead standards for well over a decade.

can do better, and we must. 1 2 Therefore, this bill requires our 3 own DEC to promulgate new standards based upon 4 emerging science and rigorous research. 5 bottom line is that no amount of lead is safe, and this bill will finally recognize this 6 7 principle in state law. 8 Upon implementation, it will save 9 lives. I want to thank Senator Hinchey for this bill. If this important piece of legislation becomes law, it will make a very -- mark a very major milestone in human-centered care in New York State.

Until about 50 years ago, hospice care in the United States was the province of religious charities, not medical professionals. And palliative care was treated as if it was a capitulation to death rather than an abdication of the overriding need to keep patients alive.

In 1984 my late husband Frank was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer. And two years later, it metastasized to his bones and became incredibly painful, but the doctors refused to prescribe palliative care. They were afraid he would get addicted. They were afraid that they would lose the ability to track the progression of his disease, because the pain was their number-one indicator of where the disease was going. And we had to search far and wide to find a doctor who would prescribe pain medication to Frank.

Reaching the goals of the CLCPA and making sure that New York stays a leader in renewable energy is critically important, but so is protecting our food supply and our agricultural lands.

Nowhere in statute today is taking into -- or takes into account ag land and our food production, where we know, across upstate and rural communities, most solar developments are being promulgated across farmland because it is the easiest land to do so. It's flat, it's hundreds of acres, and often the farmers or the owners of that land don't actually make the amount of money they need to keep that farm in business or to pay the taxes or the cost of that land.

What this bill does, and why this is so important, is for the first time we are requiring in statute for ORES, the Office of Renewable Energy Siting, to take into account prime agricultural lands in the four classes of soil so that we can protect our food supply, we

As a result, this is a new approach. 9 10 It does not involve the Department of Health. And therefore we think it addresses the issues 11 12 raised by the Governor in her veto last year, while addressing the underlying problem of young 13 14 people using these really very unregulated 15 substances. 16 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: 17 Through you, Mr. President, would the sponsor 18 continue to yield, please. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: Will the 20 sponsor yield? 21 SENATOR MAYER: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: 22 The sponsor yields. 23 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: 24 So 25 thank you, Senator Mayer, because that leads into

1 my next question. 2 If the Department of Health is now removed from the process, how is it that we're 3 supposed to determine what products are subject 4 to the restrictions of this bill? 5 SENATOR MAYER: Well, through you, 6 7 Mr. President, as the bill provides in Section 6, 8 if an action is brought by the Attorney General 9 for a violation of this provision, there's a 10 number of factors that the court will consider --11 whether the product contains an ingredient approved by the FDA, a steroid, creatine; whether 12 13 the labeling or marketing implies or suggests that they contribute to weight loss; and other 14 15 factors. 16 So the point is we have given the court guidance in an action by the Attorney 17 18 General to determine whether the materials sold do constitute a violation of this section of law. 19 20 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: 21 Through you, Mr. President, would the sponsor continue to yield. 22 23 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: Will the sponsor yield? 24 25 SENATOR MAYER: Yes.

The ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: 1 2 sponsor yields. 3 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: So is it that there will be a list of some kind 4 5 provided to retailers as to the products that are within this restriction? 1 SENATOR MAYER: Through you, 2 Mr. President. This bill was constructed to get at the marketing of products for young people, 3 these kinds of products. So if a product 4 5 contained these ingredients and was marketed expressly as a weight loss or a dietary 6 7 supplement, that is what is the trigger for a 8 violation of this section. 9 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: 10 Through you, Mr. President, would the sponsor continue to yield. 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: Will the sponsor yield? 13 14 SENATOR MAYER: Yes. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: The 16 sponsor yields. 17 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: So 18 if I'm understanding correctly, that if it does 19 contain the ingredients I just read, but is not 20 labeled a dietary supplement, then that product 21 is not falling within this bill, is that correct? 22 SENATOR MAYER: Through you, Those factors that are listed in 23 Mr. President. Section 6 are among those the court can consider 24 25 in determining whether the product was being

marketed for achieving weight loss or muscle 1 2 building. 3 It could be that other factors, such 4 as placement of the product on a shelf that is 5 targeted for weight loss, might constitute a violation, and there is an easy remedy. 6 7 retailer needs to check the age of the buyer. 8 Once they've checked the age of the buyer, it's basically a presumption that they have met the 9 10 standard here. 11 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: 12 Through you, Mr. President, would the sponsor continue to yield. 13 14 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: Will the 15 sponsor yield? 16 SENATOR MAYER: Yes. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: The 18 sponsor yields. SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: So 19 20 is it possible, then, that something as simple as 21 mineral water or a vitamin water or some sort of 22 energy drink that contains these ingredients 23 that's not subject -- is not labeled a dietary supplement would then create a violation under 24 25 this bill?

1 SENATOR MAYER: Through you, 2 Mr. President. The bill is intended to reach 3 products and diet pills and supplements that are marketed for weight loss, and marketed or --4 5 labeled, marketed or otherwise represented for the purpose of achieving weight loss or muscle 6 7 building is described in section -- in the 8 beginning of the bill. 9 And therefore it could be that the 10 placement of a product that is not listed here in 11 a weight loss section could be construed as a violation. 12 13 However, all the retailer has to do is ask for the ID and determine that a person is 14 15 18 or older. 16 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: 17 Through you, Mr. President, would the sponsor 18 continue to yield. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: Will the 20 sponsor yield? 21 SENATOR MAYER: Yes. 22 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: The 23 sponsor yields. SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: 24 So 25 are you saying that as a backup plan, that a

small retailer should just ask for ID no matter what they're selling because, conceivably, unless he's reading the ingredients, he could be in violation of this statute unless he asks for ID from the purchaser.

SENATOR MAYER: Through you,

Mr. President, I think my colleague is missing
the point of this.

There are serious health consequences to those under 18, as documented by the Harvard School of Public Health and others, that can occur and in fact have occurred, coupled with a real fixation on weight loss and body image that have proved extremely damaging to 18 year-olds. So we start with that as the premise of the bill, and let's not forget that that's the premise.

Secondly, this is going to the marketing of products for weight loss. If some kind of water is in the weight loss section, it is unlikely that that constitutes either a diet pill, an over-the-counter diet pill or a dietary supplement for weight loss or muscle building that would constitute a violation.

Because if we're, say, in 23 Queens and someone presents an ID from the University of Virginia, it's going to be very 24 25 difficult for that mom-and-pop shop to know what

1 a true valid ID from the University of Virginia 2 looks like. And I wonder if we're setting up 3 4 our, you know, mom-and-pop shop to potentially 5 sell these products to the kids that are 6 underage. 7 SENATOR MAYER: Through you, 8 Mr. President. This is a statewide bill. It 9 affects people throughout the state. And we all 10 know, those of us who live downstate, that there's a vast number of kids who are over the 11 age of 18 who do not have driver's licenses and 12 13 do not have other kinds of ID other than student 14 ID. 15 And for those who are over 18 and 16 wish to buy these products, we are facilitating their ability to do so with a valid proof. 17 18 And I would point out, and I think 19 you saw this, it's an affirmative defense if the 20 retailer uses a scanner to determine whether the 21 ID is valid. SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: 22 23 Through you, Mr. President, would the sponsor continue to yield. 24 25 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: Will the

1 sponsor yield? 2 SENATOR MAYER: Yes. 3 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: The 4 sponsor yields. 5 SENATOR CANZONERI-FITZPATRICK: Under General Business Law Section 391, there was 6 7 an exemption for retailers who did not know that 8 a product contained a particular ingredient. SENATOR MAYER: 6 Through you, 7 Mr. President, no, I don't believe that is 8 correct. 9 We are getting at two things. 10 Over-the-counter diet pills -- there's not much question about what those are. Dietary 11 supplements for weight loss or muscle building, 12 defined in the bill, not including protein 13 powders, protein drinks, and food marketed as 14 15 containing protein unless the protein powder, 16 protein drink or food marketed as containing protein contains an ingredient other than protein 17 18 which would, considered alone, constitute a 19 dietary supplement for weight loss or muscle 20 building. 21 So you can come up with ideas of 22 things that potentially someone down the road could ultimately consider to be violations, but 23 the fact is the bill is actually quite clear at 24 25 what it is getting at: dietary supplements for

When they're 23 the appropriate enforcement authority, it's our 24 25 job as a legislature to delegate the enforcement

1 to them.

And in fact in this, this gives them the authority to bring a proceeding and to allow the court to have a great deal of discretion.

This is not -- this is actually the opposite of what I think my colleague would oppose, which is a more draconian path of the Department of Health simply slapping violations on people.

There actually needs to be a proceeding brought in Supreme Court to enjoin a violation and factors listed. And I'm confident the Attorney General has the power and has the authority and the resources to handle this.

It puts an incredible burden on 2 our local mom-and-pop shops, which are the backbone of the communities that I serve and I 3 4 suspect around the state. 5 We're not giving them guidance as to the products that are covered, yet we're giving 6 7 them absolutely no defense if they mess up, 8 because these ingredients are specific. And I 9 don't think that this is going to have the effect 10 that you're hoping. I think there could be some 11 things that we did to fix this bill. But as I said, we've also got the 12 Attorney General, who's overburdened and doesn't 13 have financial resources to enforce this. 14 So for those reasons, I'll be voting 15 16 in the negative. Thank you. We've come up with a thoughtful and responsible way to do so, having heard from many experts and young people, young people who have been the victims of the sale of these products -- which, by the way, are marketed to them.

So I am proudly voting yes. I think we need to take a step and really make a difference in this area to protect our young people. I vote aye and urge my colleagues to do the same.

agencies, including DOCCS. And in fact more than
half of all of the complaints they receive are
actually about -- are related to DOCCS.

However, currently they allow DOCCS to investigate complaints themselves, through OSI, of sexual misconduct in DOCCS facilities.

And this is not exactly working out well all the time for individuals who are victims or survivors of sexual assault in correctional facilities.

And so this is an effort to ensure that the inspector general will also investigate

So I get it that the inmates are in a particular position where they would have to report through Corrections, they wouldn't have a a way to anonymously make a complaint. This addresses that.

However, we have a lot more to do.

The amount of violence that we have seen -- there have been numerous rallies here and contacts, I'm sure, to all our offices -- that since some legislation that this body enacted, as well as the one down the hall, like the HALT, for example, there's no discipline, there is no carrot and stick aspect to incarcerated individuals. And unfortunately, that is creating a revolving door where someone will assault a corrections officer and just a few days later, no more than, what, I believe seven days later, they're right back in the general population doing the same thing.

So this is a laudable goal. I will vote for it. But I think we need to remain focused on another very critical and in fact, in

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      my opinion, more pressing issue at hand, which is
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      sexual violence against those individuals who
      protect us, those individuals who are standing

And what we found was deeply disturbing. 17 18 That despite PREA and existing laws 19 that are supposed to protect everyone in jails 20 and prisons from sexual violence, sexual abuse is 21 rampant in New York's prisons. And it persists 22 due to a lack of accountability and a 23 fundamentally flawed process for handling incidents of sexual misconduct at every step and 24 25 every level.

When the Adult Survivors Act was finally enacted last spring, over 750 individuals were empowered to take legal action regarding the sexual abuse they each experienced specifically while they were previously incarcerated in New York State prisons. Currently if an incarcerated person is the victim of sexual assault at the hands of a staff member, their avenue of recourse is to report the assault to the Office of Special Investigations, OSI, which is the internal body within DOCCS. OSI is comprised of many former correction officers, and survivors have continuously brought up that they feel uncomfortable or fearful about reporting their assault at the hands of a law enforcement officer to another current or former law enforcement officer.

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report it, they often cannot trust that this internal investigation process will lead to accountability. After all, in 2019, DOCCS reported 481 complaints of sexual abuse by staff members, and only 11 -- 11 out of 481 of those complaints, that's less than 2.5 percent of those cases -- were substantiated by OSI.

This bill will authorize the Office 1 2 of the Inspector General to receive and investigate complaints of sexual assault in any 3 DOCCS facility. Additionally, it will require 4 5 that all reports that are made by incarcerated people remain anonymous and will protect 6 7 individuals who are reporting sexual assault from 8 retaliation. 9 Mr. President, I vote aye. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT BAILEY: Senator Salazar to be recorded in the affirmative. 11 Announce the results. 12 13 I'm sorry. It does nothing protect the staff. 24 25 I've gotten to know Christina King,

1 from Coxsackie Correctional Facility, who has 2 described to me, with tears in her eyes, the abuse she has suffered and how she is an employee 3 4 of the state and gets no protection. Our ability to ensure that we can provide cheap, effective, accountable utilities for our communities is something I don't take lightly. The idea that we are presupposing here a model that will be imposed on over 3 million people down on Long Island -- that includes everybody in this chamber who voted in favor of a bill that would require Long Islanders to be provided energy in a certain way and not to have a choice. That's what we're being asked to do.

And while we're amending this bill to extend time periods to November, magically -- because I have my suspicions, Mr. President, that this report, this final report is not only already prepared, but the legislation has already been drafted. My guess. But yeah, we're going to go through the process of holding hearings and

asking people their opinion as if they have a choice, giving the illusion of a choice that isn't there.

Now, if you told me we were going to hold a hearing and we were going to actually have a debate as to whether or not the public power model or a private model actually makes sense, and that that's what this is, the future of the Long Island Power Authority, great.

But that's not what this is. So

let's call it what it is. This is an effort to

move a policy forward that isn't, in my opinion,

in the best interest of those people who live on

Long Island, is going to result in less effective

means of providing energy, higher costs for my

constituents, less accountability, and more

control from here, from Albany. From here. Not

from downstate, not from Long Island, but here.

Another authority where people in Albany can tell them what to do and yet we're the ones who are left holding the bag. My constituents are the ones who are going to end up paying for this.

addiction and mental illness. It's Catholic Charities that makes sure that the people who come to Central New York from all over the world, including places like Bhutan, South Sudan, the Congo, Syria, Afghanistan, Ukraine, and Venezuela, have access to services.

And who benefits from the charitable work of Catholic Charities? We all do, of course. But we're talking about families and our young people, seniors, people in trouble, people that require assistance. Catholic Charities simply never says no. They don't turn people away. It's the people and the volunteers and the dedication to the mission that make it all work.

Over generations my own family has intersected with Catholic Charities in different ways, as our circumstances over time and through generations have changed. My grandfather lived in a Catholic Charities senior housing on Onondaga Boulevard. Later, my wife's mother, my mother-in-law, worked with local individuals who lost their parents, that were needing tutoring, and providing childcare within Catholic Charities.
